7. Is the PDF downloadable? Yes, the ebook is available as a downloadable PDF.
8. Is there any coloring involved? While the examples might be black and white, you are encouraged to add color to your own doodles!

9. What if I get stuck? Don't be afraid to experiment and try different things. The most important thing is to have fun!
