retro-: behind, backward (e.g., retroperitoneal - behind the peritoneum)
sub-: under, below (e.g., subcutaneous - under the skin)
supra-: above, upon (e.g., suprarenal - above the kidney)
tachy-: fast, rapid (e.g., tachycardia - rapid heart rate)
trans-: across, through (e.g., transdermal - through the skin)
