For the English-language edition, Nancy has added an unpublished essay on the Magdalene and the English translation of *In Heaven and on the Earth*, a remarkable lecture he gave in a series designed to address children between six and twelve years of age. Closely aligned with his entire project of the deconstruction of Christianity, this lecture may give the most accessible account of his ideas about God.
