More importantly, why do the ulama (which literally means "those who possess knowledge [ilm], particularly of Islam") maintain a tight hierarchical system in the madrasa (Islamic seminary) community that rarely allows poor intelligent students to attain leadership positions? Why are the ulama silent in the face of ruthless murder of and discrimination against Pakistani minorities?
