E ainda teve fôlego para fomentar um movimento musical sem precedentes na história do ensino daquela região numa universidade pública. Entusiasmo e ousadia de seus dirigentes em décadas de muita criatividade. E o projeto prospera, vez que a semente de uma orquestra sinfônica germinou. Eis uma instigante leitura da curiosa história — guase cinematográfica — de um pedagogo violinista brasileiro!
