Not only does it present a wealth of new readings that shed light on the craft of the *Beowulf*-poet and inform our understanding of the poem's major episodes and themes; it further highlights the merits of adopting an interdisciplinary approach alongside a comparative vantage point. As such, *The Waning Sword* will be compelling reading for *Beowulf*-scholars and for a wider audience of medievalists.
