- 6. When is the best time to send the letter? Sending your letter shortly before or after the flight is generally a good time. This helps maximize the impact of your message during their time of reflection.

- 7. What if I don't know the veteran's address? Check with the local Honor Flight chapter for assistance in connecting with the veteran or their family.
- 8. Can I include a small gift with my letter? Small, thoughtful mementos are often appreciated, but make sure it's something that's easy to transport and won't be a hassle for the veteran to carry.
- 9. What if my handwriting is not very legible? You can type the letter and print it out; a typed letter is still very much appreciated.
