While there have been a few books published focusing on a particular form of creative spiritual practice (*Skylight Paths*, for example, has published books on beading as a spiritual practice; painting as a spiritual practice; and using clay as a spiritual practice), no one has yet explored the breadth of possibilities for creative spiritual practices contained in *Crafting Calm*.
